

CASE STUDY: EASYLINE EDGE – Sportsworks

LOCATION

West Curragh, Naul, Co. Dublin

BACKGROUND

Sportsworks specialise in construction, design and maintenance of sports grounds surfaces, painting logos and advertising on stadium pitches and different venues.

APPLICATION/CURRENT PRODUCT

We would usually mask off the area with masking tape and apply by roller, this would take 8 to 10 hours to complete.

CHALLENGE

Over paint approximately 270m of new lines over the 3 badminton courts.

THE Rocol SOLUTION

Preparation took about 1 hour, masking corners and cleaning the surface. Marking all the cross lines first took about 30 mins, we had to wait for the cross lines to dry for 30 mins before painting the long lines.

All in all, the whole process of painting the lines took 2.5 hours. That's 5.5 hours less than using masking tape and a paint roller.

WHY?

The EASYLINE EDGE applicator is a much quicker way of marking the courts. I watched a few videos of the machine working and was impressed how crisp the lines are. It's very clever the way the fan redirects the over spray back onto the line. It saved the client money and got the job done in a short window of work we are allowed to do the work.
